## **Keynote Speaker**

### <u>Guadalupe Guerrero</u>

Guadalupe Guerrero serves as Superintendent of Portland Public Schools, the largest school district in Oregon, he has been in this role since October 2017. During his tenure, he led the district through a community-wide visioning process and has worked collaboratively with schools and the Portland community to reImagine Portland Public Schools. He currently serves on the executive committee of the Council of Great City Schools. Guerrero is an experienced leader in large urban school systems,

having worked for 10 years in the Boston Public Schools and another decade with the San Francisco Unified School District.

In San Francisco, he served as Deputy Superintendent of Instruction, Innovation and Social Justice where he oversaw the district's portfolio of 129 schools, early education, curriculum & instruction, student support services, special education, and the



district's innovation team. In Boston, he was a principal and cluster leader where he facilitated professional learning for a designated cohort of principals and provided input on district improvement plans as a member of the Superintendent's cabinet.

Guerrero began his career teaching across grade levels in various school settings in Oakland, San Francisco, and Boston public schools, including in Spanish bilingual, elementary literacy specialist, and middle school math & science teacher roles. Guerrero has two master's degrees from Harvard Graduate School of Education: the School Leadership Program and the highly selective Urban Superintendents Program. He holds a bachelor's degree in History from the University of California, Los Angeles, and also studied music education and classical violin at the UCLA School of Arts.

Guerrero recently celebrated his 20-year anniversary with his wife Carolyn, who is a longtime elementary school teacher; they have a son and daughter who are recent public high school graduates. As an espoused public servant who, as a youth, attained Eagle Scout's rank, grew up as an English language learner and studied music, Guerrero advocates for environment-related causes, immigrant rights, and is an arts education champion.

#### Araceli Cruz

Araceli was born in Michoacán Mexico. She holds a B.A from Linfield University and an M.A from Lewis and Clark Graduate School of Education and Counseling. She is a past participant of the Hispanic Leadership class (2014) and a past scholarship recipient. Araceli's personal story of navigating the collegiate space as a First-Generation Latina student has greatly influenced the foundation and approach to her work as a higher education advocate. She has over 10 vears of professional expertise in the areas of college access. student success, statewide issues, holistic community-based strategies, and financial aid & scholarships. She is passionate about advancing educational equity and economic justice for all students. She is committed to removing barriers for underrepresented groups, including BIPOC, Undocumented, DACAmented, & First-Generation students, in higher education.



She uses her bilingual and bicultural gifts to develop culturally specific strategies to bolster students' success and family engagement in post-secondary institutions and operates through an asset basedlens which recognizes the wealth of skills and experiences historically marginalized students contribute to post-secondary institutions. In 2020, was awarded with the Distinguished Service Award from the Oregon Association of Student Financial Aid Administrators for advancing equitable practices to serve the changing demographics of students in Oregon.

She currently serves on the Latinx Student Success Advisory Committee with the Oregon Department of Education, serves on various scholarship committees, and on local non-profit boards. In her free time she enjoys traveling with her husband, spending time with her niece & nephew, and wine tasting.




