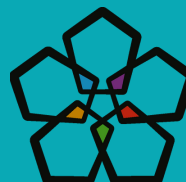

- WHEREAS, the observation started in 1968 as Hispanic Heritage Week under President Lyndon Johnson and was expanded to Hispanic Heritage Month by President Ronald Reagan in 1988; and
- WHEREAS, Beaverton is home to many people whose ancestors came from Mexico, Central and South America, the Caribbean, and Spain; and
- WHEREAS, September 15 is significant as the anniversary of independence for Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras and Nicaragua; and
- WHEREAS, Mexico and Chile celebrate Independence Day on September 16 and September 18, respectively; and
- WHEREAS, people of Hispanic descent have contributed to our shared prosperity and culture throughout the history of Beaverton, the State of Oregon, and the United States; and
- WHEREAS, Hispanic Americans continue to be crucial to the vitality, hometown livability, and growth of our community; and
- WHEREAS, the City of Beaverton champions respect for diverse voices and ideas as a core civic value; and



Whereas

Whereas, the Hispanic heritage of the United States extends historically over five centuries and has been a consistent and vital influence in our country's growth and prosperity; and

Whereas, Hispanic or Latino culture is tied to Iberian ancestry, the rich tapestry of their culture recognizes that Hispanics or Latinos are multiracial and multicultural, and also trace their historical roots to Indigenous and African ancestry. Hispanics represent people with origins from 24 different countries throughout Latin America, South America, Spain, and the United States; and

Whereas, Oregon's Latino population continues to grow at a rate faster than the national rate. 12% of Oregon's population is Latino, representing a 72% growth since the year 2000. In Portland, almost 10% of the city's over 650,000 residents are of Hispanic descent; and

Whereas, Hispanics have supported Portland's economy with myriad of contributions in the fields of commerce, science, technology, public service, health, and much more; and

Whereas, Portland recognizes the many organizations, institutions, and people helping Hispanics overcome disparities such as poor health outcomes and low educational attainment, working tirelessly to ensure they remain a flourishing community; and

Whereas, continued access to jobs and livable wages for Oregon Latinos is essential for our state to thrive, Hispanics currently make up 5% of the City of Portland's workforce. To help connect more Hispanics to City jobs and to support them throughout their careers with the City, the Unidos Latinos Americanos (ULA) City employee affinity group was re-established in 2014.

Now, therefore, I, Ted Wheeler, Mayor of the City of Portland, Oregon, the "City of Roses," do hereby proclaim September 2021 to be

Before joining Fresh, Marcelino founded Uncorked Studios, a strategic product design studio. For nine years they worked with many

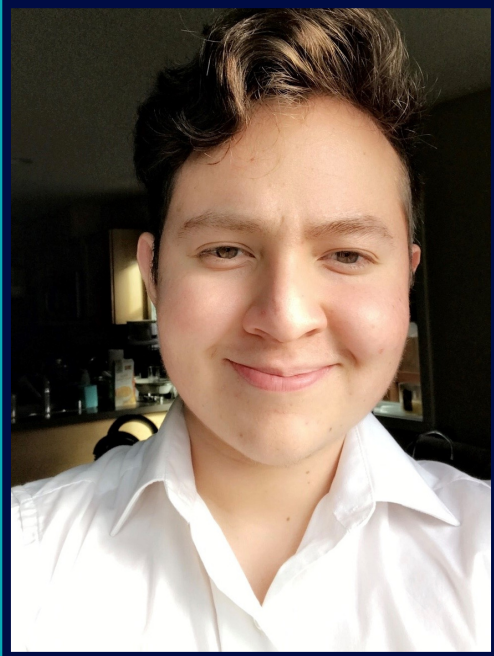
